As we approach the end of the calendar year, I have been reflecting on the work we have accomplished while looking forward to the exciting opportunities we can provide to our students. With the approval of our Strategic Plan this fall, it is time to start turning those initiatives into a reality in order to provide for continued student growth and facility improvements.

Based on the research we conducted as part of the strategic planning process, our community (students, staff, and parents) explicitly expressed their desire for an enhanced space for our outstanding performing arts programs. While the need and desire are evident, a potential construction project is significant in scope and must be carefully examined. It does, however, lend itself to consideration while giving me reason to closely evaluate our facilities, space utilization, and financial viability.

My first concern is whether or not the community would support such an endeavor. My second concern is how to fund a new capital improvement project of this size. Additionally, I question what is the most feasible means to add space? Is it by purchasing land and building a stand-alone structure or by renovating and adding on to our oldest building, the Middle School? Both options provide many opportunities, including additional instructional space, refurbished classrooms, academic programming expansion, a designated space for student and community performances, presentations, events, and an upgraded gym and locker rooms.

Money is always a sensitive topic, and one that I am very cognizant of at all times. Evergreen Local Schools is in a solid financial position that affords us the opportunity to explore facility improvements. With the undetermined amount of income to be received from the Nexus and Rover pipelines to assist with the cost of such a project, the possibility of such a venture may be more than just an item on a Christmas wish list.

We wish you and your loved ones a special holiday season. As you look to 2020, may it be filled with the unlimited possibilities of all the things yet to come!






