

2020 DISTRICT REPORT CARD.

The Ohio Department of Education (ODE) recently released the 2020 Ohio School Report Cards. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, districts were not able to administer Ohio's State Assessments in the spring; therefore, school districts and their buildings did not receive overall or component grades as in the past. However, districts did receive information regarding graduation rates, prepared for success, and improving at-risk readers indicators. Data was also reported on the Third Grade Reading Guarantee promotion rate and fall reading diagnostic information for students in grades K-3, which shows students moving from not-on-track in 2019 to on track in 2020. Below is a comparison between the limited 2020 data the 2019 report card data. Evergreen students continue to show improvement in these areas.

NEW GRADING SCALE FOR EHS-

When the new 2020-2021 school year started, EHS implemented a new 10-point grading scale. In addition, the Advanced Placement (AP) and Honors courses include a weighted scale. According to the Ohio Revised Code, because Evergreen grants weighted grades for its AP and Honors courses, CCP courses in the same content area are also assigned weighted grades. According to Dr. Dolores Swineford, assistant superintendent and curriculum director, almost all districts in the region are currently operating on a 10-point grading scale, and this levels the playing field for our students when competing for scholarships and applying for college admissions. FINANCIAL UPDATE

The District ended FY20 in better financial shape than anticipated, with a cash balance of \$10,213,970 in spite of the loss of over \$240,000 in state funding as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. While FY21 promises to be a challenging year for our students, staff, and community, the district remains well-positioned financially to meet at least the immediate challenges we are faced with.

Evergreen remains on firm financial footing in spite of the loss of state funding in FY20 and the projected reduction in both income tax revenue and state foundation funding in the current fiscal year. During the past fiscal year, the district received Public Utility Personal Property (PUPP) revenue from both the Rover and NEXUS pipelines which helped somewhat mitigate the loss of revenue in other areas. Both pipelines, however, have appealed their valuations for the second time, and it is still unclear the amount of revenue the district can expect to receive moving forward. The district completed an LED lighting upgrade in the EES building and will soon finish an LED upgrade in the high school and outdoors. The cost of these projects is expected to be repaid within two to three years from electricity cost savings. The EMS building will likely be upgraded in the near future as well. The district is currently in the process of completing the following capital improvement projects:

- Re-roofing the EES building which is completely funded by the Roof Replacement Capital Project Fund established and funded in the late FY19.
- Replacing obsolete fire alarm panels district-wide with a new system, paid for from the Permanent Improvements Fund and the OSFC Maintenance Fund.

In anticipation of reduced revenue streams due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the district has taken steps to curtail spending for the current fiscal year including:

- Implementing a Reduction-In-Force- of several classified staff positions and reduced hours in several others.
- Reducing budgets for all non-essential supplies and equipment.
- Holding off purchasing new school busses.

DISTRICT RECOGNITION

According to the State Report Card, Evergreen Local Schools continues to improve its academic performance. Evergreen was recognized for the following accomplishments for the 2019-2020 school year:

- The District received a grade of "B," on the State Report Card issued by the Ohio Department of Education (ODE).
- The District received a Momentum Award for the third consecutive year from ODE for exceeding expectations in student
 growth for the year. The District earned straight A's on all Value-Added measures on the 2019 Ohio School Report Card.
 Evergreen was the only district in Fulton County to receive the 2019 award. In all, only 48 districts across Ohio received
 this prestigious award.
- EES received an ODE Momentum Award for receiving A's on every Value-Added measure included on the State Report Card. EES was one of 173 schools recognized by the Ohio Department of Education and only one of two schools in Fulton County to receive the award. This is the first time EES earned this accolade.
- ODE recognized EES with an "Overall A" Award for the high marks received on the State Report Card.



ACADEMIC PROGRAMMING

This past year, the following academic opportunities were made available to enhance student learning:

- New English Language Arts curriculum was instituted for students in grades 6-12.
- The EHS culinary fundamentals and global foods classes attended the National Restaurant Association ServSafe Level 1, Person In Charge, Food Safety Certification. A total of 31 EHS students obtained certification recognized by restaurants.
- EMS instituted a new 6th grade math Student of the Month program. Students were recognized for their academic performance, strong effort, upstanding character, and respectful behavior in the classroom.
- All 3rd graders attended the Fulton County Ag Fest hosted by the Fulton County Soil and Water Conservation District. The event featured nearly 20 different ag-related stations and provided educational and hands-on opportunities.
- All students in grades 4-12 received a Chromebook as part of the District's 1:1 computer program. Third grade students also received Chromebooks during the COVID-19 shutdown in order to successfully participate in remote learning.

STUDENT SUCCESS

Evergreen students continue to excel in the classroom while representing the District throughout the community and surrounding areas. A few of their many 2019-2020 accomplishments include:

- Evergreen High School's Class of 2020 graduated 97 students, including 13 students who attended the Four County Career Center. In addition, 21 students met the rigorous criteria set forth by ODE and received an Honors Diploma.
- Varsity Boys Basketball Team was named NWOAL Champions, D-III Sectional and District Champs, and Regional Finalists-Ohio's Elite 8. The team finished with an overall record of 25-1 and an NWOAL record of 7-0.
- EHS's FFA organization graduated four students who continued to achieve their American Degrees, the highest award an FFA member can achieve, through their collegiate chapters. In addition, one State FFA Degree was awarded.
- EHS Quiz Team qualified for the fourth year in a row to compete in the National Small Schools Quiz Team Tournament, in Chicago; however, COVID-19 canceled the event. The EHS Quiz Team competed virtually in BGSU's Brain Game and finished as first-place champions.
- The 7th grade girls basketball game finished their season 18-1 overall, 6-0 in the NWOAL, and won the NWOAL title.
- The EHS Trap Team was named the Fulton County Champions taking first place against the FFA chapters of Wauseon, Delta, Pettisville, Archbold, and Fayette.
- EHS Girls Soccer Team was named Sectional Champions.

SAFETY, SECURITY & SUPPORT

In addition to providing a quality education, the District's top priority is the safety, security, and support of its students and staff. The following measures were completed in 2019-2020:

- District faculty and staff received campus emergency training, "Stop the Bleed", conducted by local health professionals.
- Three positions were created to help serve student needs: District Attendance Officer, Online Education/Credit Recovery Teacher, and a full-time Special Education Director overseeing students in grades Pre-K through12.
- EES preschoolers and first graders received fire safety training from local fire departments and first responder teams.
- Nine EMS students attended the first Youth Summit, hosted by Fulton County's Healthy Choices Caring Communities (HC3).
- During the 10-week COVID-19 school closure, more than 30 staff members volunteered their time packing and delivering lunches across the district to nearly 200 students in need. These students were provided with 5 lunches each week.
- All EHS females in grades 9-12 received self-defense training provided by Keeping Our Girls Safe (KOGS).
- Evergreen Schools, in partnership with the Fulton County Health Department and Fulton County Job and Family Services, implemented the Ruling Our eXperiences (ROX) Program to all students in grades 5-12. Evergreen was the first school in Fulton County to offer the program in the elementary, middle, and high school.

FACILITIES UPDATE

The Evergreen's facilities are a point of pride for students, faculty, staff, and community members. This past year, the following facility upgrades occurred:

- Bullet-proof film was placed on all building entrance doors, paid for through a Bureau of Workers' Compensation grant.
- Installed a NightLoc security system on all district office and classroom doors to protect in case of an intruder situation.
- Eighteen school busses were equipped with stop-arm cameras to protect students during boarding and unloading.
- Additional digital cameras were installed across the district for added protection and security.
- Completed LED lighting upgrades throughout the EES buildings.
- Created additional office space for district employees as well as refurbished the media center with new flooring.
- The Pifer Field press box and signage received a paint update provided by members of the EHS Art Club.
- All-weather track was resurfaced and lined.
- Baseball and softball fields received water drainage improvements and infield reconditioning.
- Updated several classrooms, labs, and media center with new furniture more conducive to student learning.

SHARED COMMUNICATION

Communicating student experiences, promoting positive community relationships, and providing updated news in a timely manner are critical in today's fast-paced world. The following steps are taken to effectively share information:

- The three district publications; The Viking Navigator (community newsletter), The Horn (internal employee newsletter), and the Annual Report to the Community, continue to inform the community and employees of Evergreen happenings.
- The Evergreen website (www.evgvikings.org) and social media pages on Facebook and Twitter allows the district to share new information, athletic messages, and public announcements.
- Student success boards were placed in the EHS cafeteria highlighting student academic success.
- Signage was created and displayed throughout the buildings celebrating the district's mission statement and core beliefs.

STRATEGIC PLANNING

The District has developed an all-inclusive strategic plan that serves as its directional framework for the next 5 years.

- The goals of the strategic plan are to increase student opportunities, improve student preparedness for the future, and to improve the overall student experience while at Evergreen.
- District goals and objectives have also been constructed to help focus on continuous improvement measures.
- Vision and mission statements have been recreated as well as the development of a set of core beliefs that clearly state the district's passion, commitment, and purpose.
